Subject:

Fees for pesticide vendor, applicator and operator licenses and fees for applicator exams.

Objective:

To outline the implementation and administration of license and exam fees.

Background:

As part of a cost recovery exercise identified during the Program Review, the Department of Environment and Labour was directed to institute a fee schedule for vendors, applicators and operators for pesticide operations as well as for applicator examinations. This policy directive outlines the details of the implementation and administration of the fees to be applied to licenses and exams.

Statutory Authority:

Section 21 of the *Executive Council Act* allows the minister to establish tariffs or fees to be paid to government for inspections, issuing licenses, permits, grants, conveyances or in respect of applications for same and for searching a register, file or document kept by the department.

Policy:

The following charges will be applied to all licenses and exams administered by the Pesticides Control Section, Department of Environment and Labour:

Fee payment must be in the form of a cheque or money order. Cheques or money orders must be made out to *Newfoundland Exchequer Account*. In addition, a receipt from Central Cashier indicating that payment has been received will be accepted. Cash payments will **not** be accepted.
