# **Engineered Wetlands Win Again**

Abydoz Environmental's Engineered Wetlands win Leadership Award in Wastewater Management for Atlantic Canada.

The central Newfoundland towns of Appleton and Glenwood were presented with the national Watershed Award for "Leadership in Stormwater and Wastewater Management" for Atlantic Canada by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) and the Insurance Bureau of Canada (IBC) at the FCM National Conference in Toronto last week.

This is the fourth award for the towns related to their Engineered Wetland System.

Previous awards were; the Gander and Area Chamber of Commerce Environmental

Award in 2007, the Newfoundland and Labrador Provincial Environmental Award in 2008,

and this year's Professional Engineers and Geoscientists Environmental Award.
